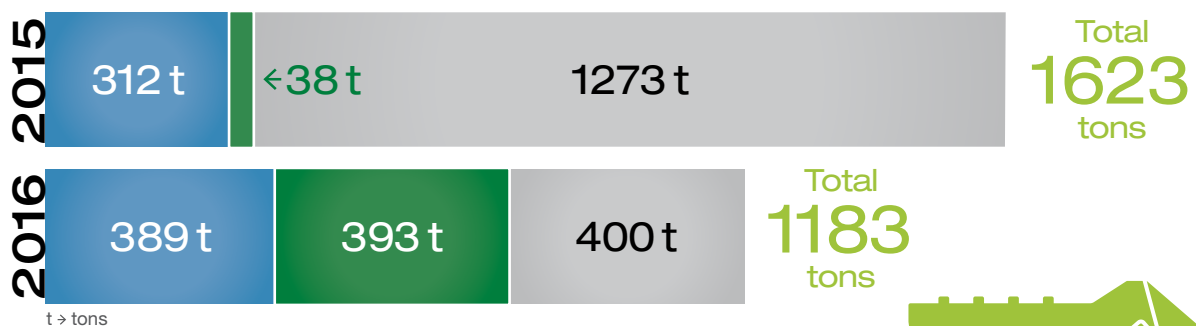

Your good work is already making a difference!

The different types of PLASTIC

Not all plastics are recyclable. The general rule is that a soft plastic belongs in the clear bag (see exceptions below) and a hard plastic belongs in the blue bag.

By putting all the bags of the same colour together (as shown below), you are helping the haulers collect the whole region in less time."

BULKY WASTE

(Large item pickup)

List of accepted waste for the special pickups:

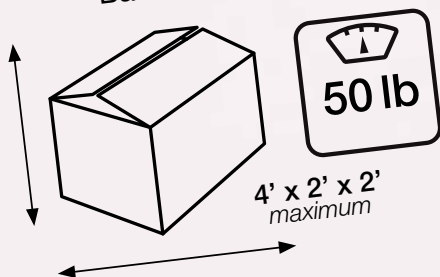
- Appliances (white goods and metal units)
- Small household appliances: Microwave, toaster oven, dehumidifier, air conditioner, coffee machine...
- Oversized items: Mattress, couch and love seat, area rug, table and chairs...
- Plumbing fixtures: Toilets, bathtubs, sinks, piping...
- Electronic waste (E-waste): Computer, laptop, printer, television, DVD/Blu-ray player, VHS recorder, radio...
- Garden waste in bundles
- Some construction and demolition (CD) waste in bundle: Wood, asphalt shingles, carpet, house siding



Help us keeping waste collectors safe during large item pickups.

- ☐ All waste must be organised in bundles, bags or boxes of 4' x 2' x 2' and must not exceed 50 lb. (1.2 m x 0.6 m x 0.6 m / 23 kg)

Ballot, sac et boîte



- ☐ Only **clear transparent bags** will be accepted during the large item collection. No opaque bags will be collected (black, orange, etc.)
- ☐ We will pick up reasonable amounts of waste. Try to stay within the limit of **a half-ton load**.
- ☐ **We will not** collect items in trailers or truck beds.

Free collections of Household Hazardous Waste (HHW)

Bring us your household hazardous waste (HHW) such as:

paint
solvent
fluorescent
light bulbs
batteries
pesticides
chemical products



Only hazardous waste from residents will be accepted.

NOTE: Empty containers are not hazardous. You can dispose of them with your recyclables (blue bag) EXCEPT FOR PROPANE.

The KRSC is bringing back its backyard composting program in 2017. A limited supply of composters and digesters has been ordered and will be available at a discounted price for the population of the Kent region.

Would you rather compost your organic waste?

◀ Earth Machine



Pros

- Compost can be used around the house or in the garden
- The composter is more affordable

Cons

- Requires more constant work to stir and collect the finished product
- Does not accept all organic products

Or digest it?

Green Cone ▶

Pros

- The digester takes all organic products (Yes, even meat and dairy products!)
- Nearly maintenance-free

Cons

- The unit is more expensive
- Does not produce compost that can be distributed elsewhere

WHY COMPOST?

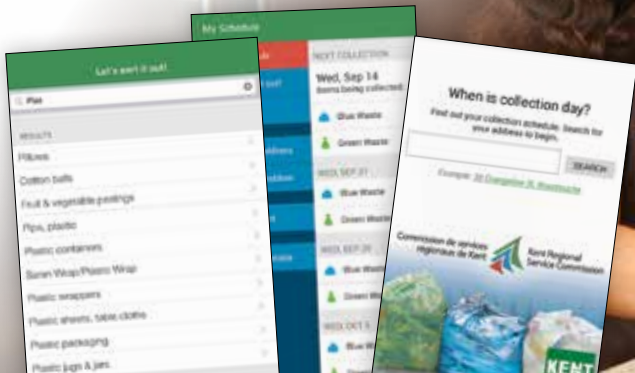
Household composting helps to:
