Here is the breakdown for the KRSC's 2024 Budget. The amounts allocated are for services provided by the different divisions to the residents of Kent County.

# Civic 22 Numbers

Did you **know?** 

To obtain your civic number and address for your property, you will need to get in touch with the KRSC, as we are responsible for assigning civic numbers and addresses to properties within our jurisdiction. To apply, you will need to fill out a short form and provide your PID number. It's important to note that you should provide your PID number and not your PAN, as there can be multiple PIDs associated with one PAN.

Once you have submitted the necessary information, KRSC will review your request and assign a civic number and address to your property. It's crucial to ensure that your property is correctly identified with a civic number and address, as it is required for various purposes such as emergency services, building permits, mail delivery and legal documentation.

# New project gives a helping hand to the homeless in the Kent area

**Public Safety** 

December 2023, the Public In Safety Department of the KRSC, in collaboration with the RCMP and the Vitalité Health Network, launched an initiative in the Kent region to help homeless individuals. The initiative involves preparing backpacks filled with warm clothing, toiletries and non-perishable snacks. Thanks to generous donations from the KSRC, Shoppers Drug Mart Richibucto and the Suicide Prevention Committee, 20 backpacks were prepared. The bags will be distributed by RCMP members over the winter months.



## **Planet Youth Launch**

The launch of the Planet Youth substance abuse prevention program, held on Thursday, February 15, 2024, was a great success thanks to members of the KSRC, Vitalité Health Network and the Town of Grand Bouctouche. More than 250 people attended, including students from École Clément-Cormier, Bonar Law Memorial and École Mgr-Marcel-François-Richard, as well as the various partners in the Planet Youth project and members of the municipalities involved.







# Did you know?

Thanks to KRSC's support, all tourism businesses are now members of Destination Southeast New Brunswick (DSENB). In 2023, this organization uplifted tourism businesses and promoted the region through various initiatives. These included:

- An advertising campaign strategically targeting New Brunswickers, as well as residents of Ontario, Quebec, and other Atlantic Provinces, utilizing platforms like Facebook, Instagram, Google, and billboards. This campaign garnered over 1.6 million views and 36,000 web page views;
- A series of 80 social media posts and 40 organic videos specifically crafted to highlight and promote local operators within the region;
- Comprehensive updates to the DSENB website, incorporating informative blogs and content aimed at aiding visitors in planning their trips to the area;
- Introduction of a Cultural Market event tailored for families within the region, enhancing local cultural experiences;
- Development of shoulder-season content to effectively extend the tourism period and maximize economic benefits;
- Hosting a Tourism Forum to equip local business owners with valuable insights and resources to thrive in the tourism sector;
- Participation in prominent events such as Saltcape in Halifax and RV shows in Quebec to actively promote the region to wider audiences.

DSENB plans to boost tourism in the region with more tailored content to support local businesses, partnerships for radio promotions, and attractive packages for visitors. We'll enhance content for year-round vitality, host a Tourism Forum for knowledge exchange, and reprise the Cultural Market event for immersive experiences.

# BULKY WASTE - Important tips and tricks for your next pick-up and to be a good neighbour

 Call or register online before placing your bulky waste at the end of your driveway (506-743-1490 or krsc.ca)







- Place your items at the end of the driveway before 4 a.m. on Monday morning. You may put them at the end of the driveway on the weekend before the collection week.
- Building materials are accepted in bundles no larger than 1.2 x 0.6 x 0.6 m (4 x 2 x 2 ft) and 23 kg (50 lb).



## Remember to follow the regular 3-stream program:

Use green bags for organic waste (if it is edible, put it in the green bag!).

Use blue bags for recyclable waste (remember to rinse containers before throwing them in the garbage).

Use clear bags for everything else.
