10. REPORTS ON COLLABORATIVE SERVICES ACTIVITIES

a. Planning

The minutes of the Planning Review Advisory Committee meeting of August 29th and October 3rd, 2023 as well as the construction report for October 2023, are circulated.

b. Solid Waste

The minute of the Solid Waste Management Committee of May 3rd, 2023 as well as the October 2023 Solid Waste Report are circulated. Isabelle Godin gives some clarifications to the solid waste report.

c. Public Safety

Paul Lang attended the Canadian Crime Prevention Association Conference in Regina a few weeks ago, where the Atlantic region was very well represented. Training on "Crime Prevention Through Environmental Design" could possibly be offered in Kent or New Brunswick. A meeting between Paul Lang, Miguel Allain, Jean Goguen and the trainer is scheduled for next week. The program is accredited by the Western Association of Planners and could also be used by municipal recreation directors and general managers. As an example, when a park is created, the training would help choose the best place to put bathrooms, trees, cameras, etc., in the park.

d. Economic Development

Paul Lang explains the motion before the vote.

WHEREAS the Kent Regional Service Commission has created an Economic Development Committee composed of elected officials and business people;

WHEREAS the Economic Development Committee is made up of a maximum of 2 members of the Board of Directors who are stakeholders in the field;

WHEREAS the 2 members of the Board of Directors chosen at this meeting will know the duration of their mandate following the first meeting of the committee where an election for the presidency of the committee will take place and the determination of the mandates of each member; WHEREAS the Board of Directors can appoint other people according to the sectors identified in the committee's terms of reference and that an election would take place for the coveted positions.

Mennonites came from November 4 to 8, 2023 to make offers to purchase a number of properties in the Acadieville area. The lawyers spoke to each other and tentative agreements were reached with a number of owners. If all goes well, there could be initial construction as early as 2024, followed by family relocations. They have also asked our consultant about other properties for sale in the area. As soon as the sales are finalized, we'll have to work with the municipality of Nouvelle-Arcadie to publish monthly "Did you know" articles in their local newspaper, to start informing the community about the arrival of these people.

e. Tourism Promotion

A few weeks ago, Marie-Paul Robichaud attended the Salon VR Québec with Destination Southeast and someone from the Town of Grand-Bouctouche. Feedback was very positive. The format of the show has changed a little to allow more dialogue and exchange with show participants. The Akadi Lumina attraction was certainly part of the discussion. We could end up with people from Quebec who want to visit the Lumina and camp in our region.

f. Community Development

Kent Region is the first region in the province to accept the Regional Resiliency Plan for fiscal year 2024. Funds of \$50,000 are received annually. A portion of these funds is included in our budget. Chanelle Daponte and Stéphanie Caissie worked very hard to prepare an action plan to obtain these funds, and it paid off.

g. Regional Transportation

The minutes of the Regional Transportation Committee meetings of September 29th, 2022, June 21st and September 11th, 2023 were circulated.

The Regional Transport service is doing very well. Four new drivers have been added in the last month. However, demand exceeds the number of drivers. A promotion was made to the Club d'âge d'or de St-Antoine and a seniors' group in Cocagne. This has helped to attract new drivers. Each municipality is strongly encouraged to promote the program. Isabelle presented a table of statistics, dated September 2023, to give an idea. A detailed table will be presented at the December 21st Board meeting. Paul Lang explains that the strategy includes the possibility of purchasing 2 electric vehicles to enable volunteers who would like to do voluntary work but not use their own vehicle. So this is a project with FCM that was scheduled to start in February 2024 but has been pushed back to summer 2025.

h. Recreation Planning

The minutes of the Recreation, Sport and Culture Committee meetings of July 17th, July 28th and September 11th, 2023 are circulated.

A new program called "Physical Litteracy for Communities" will be implemented in the region's municipalities. Funding has been received from this organization. A meeting will be held with all recreation directors in the region to explain how the program works and how it should be implemented. The Étoile de l'Acadie school in Nouvelle-Arcadie and the Clément-Cormier school in Grand-Bouctouche have already indicated their interest in implementing the program at the school level. It's a start, but the program will be implemented throughout Kent. Half a resource will be hired to work with the communities to implement the program.
