7. PRESENTATIONS

a. AmbulanceNB

Jean-Pierre Savoie, Vice President of Ambulance NB, gives a presentation to the Board of Directors with the goal of encouraging open and ongoing communication with mayors and representatives from rural districts across the province of New Brunswick. During his presentation, Mr. Savoie outlines the pressures facing the ambulance system, shares the organization's concerns, and highlights current challenges. He also presents relevant statistics, discusses upcoming programs, and explores potential initiatives aimed at attracting more individuals to enroll in paramedic training.

b. Trails study

Jane McCulloch, consultant with Terminus Consulting, presents the feasibility study for a regional active trail network. She explains the objective of the study as well as the methodology used, which included compiling feedback from respondents to an online survey and input gathered during more than 15 public sessions. She outlines the main findings of the study and highlights the strategic themes that emerged, providing concrete examples and additional information to illustrate their significance. In conclusion, Jane presents a series of recommendations to the Board of Directors regarding possible next steps for the development of active trails.

c. Health

The report from the June 10 meeting with Vitalité NB has been circulated.

WHEREAS Vitalité Health Network has undertaken an exercise to develop a master plan for Stella-Maris-de-Kent Hospital;

WHEREAS Vitalité Health Network has hired CIM Consulting to lead the master plan development exercise;

WHEREAS Vitalité Health Network accepted the Kent RSC's request to be part of the consultation process for the development of the master plan. First Nations, as well as a group of newcomers, participated in the consultation process:

WHEREAS Vitalité Health Network Senior Director of Infrastructure Marco Ouellette, along with CIM Consulting, presented the results of the master plan to the Kent RSC Health Committee in the winter of 2025. A copy of the master plan was also circulated to Kent RSC elected officials;

WHEREAS the Vitalité Health Network Board of Directors adopted the master plan for the Stella-Marisde-Kent Hospital and forwarded it to the Department of Health in order to move the file forward;

WHEREAS the master plan proposes two infrastructure options: the construction of a new hospital or the renovation and expansion of the existing building;

WHEREAS modification of the current infrastructure, either through the renovation and expansion of the existing hospital or the construction of a new hospital, is necessary and must be carried out in accordance with the master plan;

WHEREAS the master plan proposes the addition and expansion of a range of services, such as:

- Improved emergency services (larger spaces and more stretchers);
- The return of hospital beds with an emphasis on stays of up to 7 days;
- The addition of 2 radiology machines;
- The addition of an ultrasound machine;
- The addition of a computed tomography (CT) scanner;
- The addition of outpatient clinics;
- The addition of one-day nursing follow-ups;
- The addition of an endoscopy clinic and recovery beds;
- The addition of dialysis services (up to 6 chairs);
- The addition of oncology services (up to 6 chairs);
- Adding additional primary health care, public health, and mental health services.

WHEREAS the master plan timelines are too long with regard to the addition and delivery of essential services to the population served by the SMKH, and for this reason, the KRSC wishes to prioritize services to be implemented in the short and medium term (2 to 5 years);

WHEREAS some of these services could be provided outside the walls of a hospital and instead in the community;

WHEREAS the Kent RSC Health Committee and Board of Directors met in April to discuss the options presented and agreed by consensus to focus on adding services rather than deciding on one of the two options for hospital infrastructure.
